SUBJECT: CANADIAN FEDERATION OF STUDENTS DRAFT BUDGET 1988 - 1989

Attached is a copy of the draft 1988 - 1989 operating budget of the Canadian Federation of Students as approved for distribution by the Federation's National Executive.

The format of this year's budget is substantially different from that of previous years. Traditionally, 'joint expenses' (expenses shared equally by the Canadian Federation of Students and the Canadian Federation of Students - Services) have been presented by splitting them 50-50 between the National budget and the budget for Services. This year, the money to be recovered from Services for joint expenses is listed with other revenues, and the <u>full</u> cost of these disbursements is given in the expenditure section of the National budget.

Many of the projections for the 1988 - 1989 fiscal year are based on significantly different assumptions than in 1987 - 1988, some of which require Constitutional or Policy amendments. These include a reduction in the required level of the budgeted surplus from 3% of revenues to 1.5% and the elimination of the position of Campaign Coordinator.

This budget also assumes a \$15/delegate increase in members' delegate fees to Federation General Meetings and a \$25/delegate increase for observers. Both the National Graduate Council grant and the expenditures on Campaign have been substantially increased over the 1987 - 1988 levels, following recommendations from the November 1987 Semi-Annual General Meeting.

Other changes are outlined in the notes to the 1988 - 1989 draft budget. I encourage you to read through this documentation carefully. CANADIAN FEDERATION OF STUDENTS 1988 - 1989 DRAFT BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS

The following details the assumptions made in the preparation of the Canadian Federation of Students 1988 - 1989 draft budget as at April 22, 1988.

REVENUES are based on the expected revenue from the current membership in 1987 - 1988.

BUDGETED SURPLUS is equal to 1.5% of expected membership fee and ISIC revenues, based on the National Executive's recommendation to amend the Federation's standing policy.

EXPENDITURES For the most part, disbursements have been based on actual and estimated expenses in 1987 - 1988. Some adjustment has been made to reflect expected inflation. Specific costs have been determined as follows:

SALARIES follow the provisions of the Collective Agreement currently being negotiated by the National Executive and CUPE 1281, CFS-Sublocal. The recoveries for the Translator and seconded Researcher are shown separately. A monthly COLA increase of 0.5% is included in the cost. The Chairperson's salary has been increase by \$5,400 from 1987 - 1988.

BENEFITS: UI and CPP costs are mandatory and are based on salary. Green Shield. Alberta Health and OHIP premiums are based on current rates and Workers' Compensation is based on the 1988 cost. Sick Leave Payments and sick bank accumulation (payment of 40% of unused sick days to each employee and accumulated expense of .25 days/month/employee, respectively) are based on the terms of the current Collective Agreement with CUPE 1281, CFS sub-local. Severance assumes a payment equivalent to approximately four months' salary.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE AND GENERAL MEETINGS assumes that there will be 19 days of National Executive meetings and 12 days of General Meetings as follows:

National Executive Meetings General Meetings

August: 3 days
November: 5 days
May: 7 days

January: 3 days March: 3 days May: 5 days

It is assumed that the August meeting will be held in Toronto.

The cost of travel to Ottawa and Toronto for all National Executive members and staff assumes prices comparable to those paid in 1987 - 1988, with an adjustment to allow for increases following deregulation. A blanket cost of \$600 per person is assumed for travel for the Treasurer, Chair Elect and Deputy Chair Elect. General Meeting travel assumes that the May 1989 meeting will be held in eastern Canada. Per diems are based on \$25/day for staff and \$21/day for Executive members, with a half day travel per diem on each side of an Executive meeting. Accommodation is assumed to be \$25/day/person for both National Executive Meetings and General Meetings, with one extra day of accommodation for each meeting. The position of Campaign Coordinator has been omitted from the draft budget on the recommendation of the National Executive.

FIELDWORKER expenses for National Executive and General Meetings are as described above. Each fieldworker has calculated the travelling which would be required in her/his region in 1988 - 1989.

NEGOTIATIONS assumes that the current negotiations will be completed in 1987 - 1988 and that the term of the new Collective Agreement will be for three years.

OFFICE RENT is based on an annual lease of \$11.50/square foot plus a monthly cost of \$550 for shared costs.

POSTAGE has increased as a result of the developing communications strategy of the Federation which will involve a wider distribution of the Bulletin and other information materials. As well, there have major structural changes in postal charges by Canada Post.

TELEPHONE includes the new CFSnet service to be used by all National Executive members, fieldworkers and the Ottawa office in 1988 - 1989.

GENERAL MEETINGS assume 130 delegates in November and 140 in May. Except for translation, which has dropped significantly with the hiring of a staff translator, costs will be comparable to those in 1987 - 1989. Delegate fees for General Meetings are assumed at \$440/person for members and \$650 for observers based fon recommendations of the National Executive.

CONSTITUENCY GROUPS - NATIONAL GRADUATE COUNCIL grant has been set at 35% for 1988 - 1989, following a National Executive recommendation that a policy be established setting the NGC's minimum grant at 25% of all graduate student membership fees, and that this be increased this by 10% for 1988 - 1989.

STUDENT RIGHTS was set up to help the Federation accumulate a fund of \$15,000 to initiate a constitutional challenge against differential fees. As of June 31, 1987 there was \$5,000 in the fund, and the National Executive is recommending that the remaining \$10,000 be allocated in the 1987 - 1988 fiscal year, eliminating this expense in 1988 - 1989.

BAD DEBTS is estimated at 3% of gross revenues to allow for any overestimation of membership fees.

CAMPAIGN has been increased by about \$8,000 following recommendations from the November 1987 Semi-Annual General Meeting.

CANADIAN FEDERATION OF STUDENTS 1988 - 1989 DRAFT BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS

The following details the assumptions made in the preparation of the Canadian Federation of Students 1988 - 1989 draft budget as at April 22, 1988.

REVENUES are based on the expected revenue from the current membership in 1987 - 1988.

BUDGETED SURPLUS is equal to 1.5% of expected membership fee and ISIC revenues, based on the National Executive's recommendation to amend the Federation's standing policy.

EXPENDITURES For the most part, disbursements have been based on actual and estimated expenses in 1987 - 1988. Some adjustment has been made to reflect expected inflation. Specific costs have been determined as follows:

SALARIES follow the provisions of the Collective Agreement currently being negotiated by the National Executive and CUPE 1281, CFS-Sublocal. The recoveries for the Translator and seconded Researcher are shown separately. A monthly COLA increase of 0.5% is included in the cost. The Chairperson's salary has been increase by \$5,400 from 1987 - 1988.

BENEFITS: UI and CPP costs are mandatory and are based on salary. Green Shield. Alberta Health and OHIP premiums are based on current rates and Workers' Compensation is based on the 1988 cost. Sick Leave Payments and sick bank accumulation (payment of 40% of unused sick days to each employee and accumulated expense of .25 days/month/employee, respectively) are based on the terms of the current Collective Agreement with CUPE 1281, CFS sub-local. Severance assumes a payment equivalent to approximately four months' salary.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE AND GENERAL MEETINGS assumes that there will be 19 days of National Executive meetings and 12 days of General Meetings as follows:

National Executive Meetings General Meetings

August: 3 days November: 5 days November: 5 days May: 7 days

January: 3 days March: 3 days May: 5 days

It is assumed that the August meeting will be held in Toronto.

The cost of travel to Ottawa and Toronto for all National Executive members and staff assumes prices comparable to those paid in 1987 - 1988, with an adjustment to allow for increases following deregulation. A blanket cost of \$600 per person is assumed for travel for the Treasurer, Chair Elect and Deputy Chair Elect. General Meeting travel assumes that the May 1989 meeting will be held in eastern Canada. Per diems are based on \$25/day for staff and \$21/day for Executive members, with a half day travel per diem on each side of an Executive meeting. Accommodation is assumed to be \$25/day/person for both National Executive Meetings and General Meetings, with one extra day of accommodation for each meeting. The position of Campaign Coordinator has been omitted from the draft budget on the recommendation of the National Executive.

FIELDWORKER expenses for National Executive and General Meetings are as described above. Each fieldworker has calculated the travelling which would be required in her/his region in 1988 - 1989.

NEGOTIATIONS assumes that the current negotiations will be completed in 1987 - 1988 and that the term of the new Collective Agreement will be for three years.

OFFICE RENT is based on an annual lease of \$11.50/square foot plus a monthly cost of \$550 for shared costs.

POSTAGE has increased as a result of the developing communications strategy of the Federation which will involve a wider distribution of the Bulletin and other information materials. As well, there have major structural changes in postal charges by Canada Post.

TELEPHONE includes the new CFSnet service to be used by all National Executive members, fieldworkers and the Ottawa office in 1988 - 1989.

GENERAL MEETINGS assume 130 delegates in November and 140 in May. Except for translation, which has dropped significantly with the hiring of a staff translator, costs will be comparable to those in 1987 - 1989. Delegate fees for General Meetings are assumed at \$440/person for members and \$650 for observers based for recommendations of the National Executive.

CONSTITUENCY GROUPS - NATIONAL GRADUATE COUNCIL grant has been set at 35% for 1988 - 1989, following a National Executive recommendation that a policy be established setting the NGC's minimum grant at 25% of all graduate student membership fees, and that this be increased this by 10% for 1988 - 1989.

STUDENT RIGHTS was set up to help the Federation accumulate a fund of \$15,000 to initiate a constitutional challenge against differential fees. As of June 31, 1987 there was \$5,000 in the fund, and the National Executive is recommending that the remaining \$10,000 be allocated in the 1987 - 1988 fiscal year, eliminating this expense in 1988 - 1989.

BAD DEBTS is estimated at 3% of gross revenues to allow for any overestimation of membership fees.

CAMPAIGN has been increased by about \$8,000 following recommendations from the November 1987 Semi-Annual General Meeting.

NOTES TO THE YEAR TO DATE REPORT AS AT MARCH 31, 1988

The attached year to date report for the first nine months of the 1987/88 fiscal year shows that the expenditures of the Canadian Federation of Students have been about 10% under budget. The following provides an explanation of those amount which are significantly different from the original budget for the period.

SALARIES During the first nine months of the year there were vacancies in the Researcher and the Manitoba/Saskatchewan and Alberta fieldworker positions which resulted in a net vacancy of approximately eight months. This has resulted in salaries being underspent by approximately \$10,000.

BENEFITS are below budget due mainly to the timing of the estimates for severance payments.

FIELDWORKER expenses are below budget because of the vacancy in the Manitoba/Saskatchewan and Alberta fieldworker positions.

TRANSLATION was not included in the original budget under the assumption that all general materials could be translated by the staff member. Due to the quantity of materials prepared for the members' and General Meeting mailings, some of the material had to be sent to contract translators.

PRINTING is over budget because of the cost of the Xerox rental relative to the original timing of contract printing as well as the cost of printing supplies. However, the quantity of materials produced by the Ottawa office has increased substantially from that of the last fiscal year.

PROFESSIONAL FEES are below budget due to less than expected need for legal services.

TELEPHONE costs are below budget because most National Executive representatives have not yet claimed telephone costs. As well, there have been vacancies in the Manitoba/Saskatchewan and Alberta fieldworker positions. Also, there have been less long distance charges from the Ottawa office than expected.

MAINTENANCE has been undertaken for the postage meter, computers, telephones and typewriters. Repairs are still needed for the office air conditioners.

SUBSCRIPTIONS reflects increases in subscription rates since the budget was prepared and the decision to broaden the subscription base.

GENERAL MEETINGS reflect the final income statement for the meeting plus expenses which have been undertaken for the May meeting. The November meeting was below budget due to recoveries made on printing and reduced contract translation costs.

STUDENT RIGHTS represents the National Executive's recommendation that the remaining \$10,000 of the \$15,000 the members decided to allocate to a fund for a constitutional challenge on differential fees be accumulated in the current fiscal year, rather than the \$5,000 originally budgeted.

HIRING reflects the need to fill five positions since the spring.

BANK CHARGES AND INTEREST are overt three times budget due to the timing of collecting membership fees in the fall of 1987 and the need to utilize the line of credit longer than expected.

BAD DEBTS reflects the better than expected recovery of outstanding fee receivables from 1986 - 1987 which is offset by the current year's estimate of uncollectible accounts.

CAMPAIGN reflects the cost of producing the pamphlets, manual and posters as required by the Campaign Committee directives from the May and November 1987 General Meetings

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 1988 AND MARCH 31, 1987

1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Canadian Federation of Students/Federation canadienne des étudiant(e)s ("CFS/FCE") is a tax-exempt non-profit service organization incorporated in 1981 under the Canada Business Corporations Act. CFS/FCE represents approximately 500,000 Canadian post-secondary students and provides organization assistance and representation and research resources to member institutions. Emphasis is placed on improvements to student programs, youth employment and students' concerns regarding funding levels of Canadian universities and colleges.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

b) <u>Depreciation</u>

CFS/FCE depreciates its office equipment over its estimated useful life of 3 years.

3. BANK INDEBTEDNESS

Bank indebtedness as at March 1988 was represented by a demand loan of \$35,000 and cheques written in excess of bank deposits of \$17,440. There was no bank indebtedness as at March 1987. Collateral consists of an assignment of accounts receivable.

4. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

All CFS/FCE travel services are provided by an affiliated organization. Expenses related to the National Executive and General Meetings are shared jointly with the Canadian Federation of Students - Services.

5. LONG TERM LIABILITIES TO AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS

Long term liabilities to affiliated organizations classified as current as at March 31, 1987, is represented by an interest-free loan from the Students Union of the University of Regina in the amount of \$4,000 which was repaid in full on January 31, 1988.

6. GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

CFS/FCE has obtained federal assistance for the provision of translated materials for the membership. An advance of \$15,000 was received for 1987 - 1988, with \$2,797 not spent as at March 31, 1988. The grant has been netted against the related expenditure.

7. 1987 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Certain 1987 balance sheet items have been reclassified to conform to 1988 presentation.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

JUNE 30, 1987 AND 1986

1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS

Canadian Federation of Students/Fédération Canadienne des Etudiant(e)s ("CFS/FCE") is a tax-exempt non-profit service organization incorporated in 1981 under the Canada Business Corporations Act. CFS/FCE represents approximately 500,000 Canadian post-secondary students and provides organization assistance and representation and research resources to member institutions. Emphasis is placed on improvements to student programs, youth employment and students' concerns regarding funding levels of Canadian universities and colleges.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

b) <u>Depreciation</u>

CFS/FCE depreciates its office equipment over its estimated useful life of 3 years.

3. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

All CFS/FCE travel services are provided by an affiliated organization. Expenses related to the National Executive and General Meetings are shared jointly with the Canadian Federation of Students - Services.

4. LONG-TERM LIABILITIES TO AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS

Long-term liabilities to affiliated organizations as at June 30, 1986, classified as current in 1987, is represented by an interest-free loan from the Students' Union of the University of Regina in the amount of \$4,000 due January 31, 1988.

5. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

CFS/FCE is involved in litigation with respect to the repayment of fees of approximately \$26,000 paid by a past member.

It is management's opinion that the ultimate costs of the settlement will not materially effect the financial position of CFS/FCS.

6. GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

CFS/FCE obtained federal and provincial government assistance in the amount of \$10,012 and \$2,360, respectively for general meeting and printing expenses in the year ended June 30, 1986 (none in 1987). These grants have been netted against the related expenditure.

7. 1986 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Certain 1986 expenditures have been reclassified to conform to 1987 presentation.

A GLOSSARY OF ACCOUNTING TERMS

The following definitions of accounting terms should help delegates understand the presentation of information in the financial statements of the Canadian Federation of Students, the Canadian Federation of Students - Services/AOSC and Travel CUTS.

Accounts payable: money which is owed by the organization for goods and services obtained on credit for which an invoice has been received.

Accounts receivable: money owed to an organization for goods and services provided prior to the end of the fiscal period.

Accrued liabilities: expenses which have been incurred but for which no invoice has yet been received. Examples include audit and legal services which are used throughout the year but for which no invoice is received until year end.

Accumulated depreciation: the cumulative balance of depreciation expense for the current and previous fiscal periods.

Allowance for bad debts: the accumulation of an allowance offsetting accounts receivable which reduces the receivable balance to the amount most likely to be collected.

Assets: all the physical things and other items of value owned by an organization.

Bad debts expense: the cost to the organization when money owed to it cannot be collected. Usually this refers to money owed to the organization from previous years and results in the reduction of the net accounts receivable balance through the accumulation of the allowance for bad debts.

Consolidated combined financial statements: see consolidated financial statements.

Consolidated financial statements: the preparation of financial statements for affiliated entities (parent and subsidiaries) which present the financial information as if there was a single, unified business.

Current assets: all assets which may be converted into cash or otherwise realized in the ordinary course of business within one year of the balance sheet date.

Current liabilities: all liabilities of the organization which become payable within one year of the balance sheet date.

Deferred revenue: the portion of annual revenue not yet earned by the organization due to the need to allocate revenue evenly over the twelve month fiscal year.

Deficit: the excess of expenditures over revenues for the current fiscal year.

Depreciation expense: allocation of the cost of a physical asset over its useful life, if that useful life is more than one operating year. Land cannot be depreciated. (See fixed assets and accumulated depreciation.)

Expenses: the amounts that the organization spends to provide goods and services to its customers or members, excluding amounts spent of the acquisition of fixed assets. Expenses are incurred when goods or services are provided, whether of not payment has been made by the end of the fiscal year. (See accounts payable and accrued liabilities.)

Fiscal year: the twelve month period chosen by the organization as the year for which it is reporting. The Canadian Federation of Students, the Canadian Federation of Students - Services/AOSC and Travel CUTS all have year ends on June 30th.

Fixed assets: all assets which are considered to have a useful life over one year, including land. (See depreciation.)

Fund balance: cumulative balance of excess revenues over expenditures. (Canadian Federation of Students - Services/AOSC)

Liabilities: all the money owed to others by the organization. (See current liabilities and long term liabilities.)

Long term liabilities: debt which is not due to be paid within one year of the balance sheet date.

Members' deficit: see Retained earnings.

Members' surplus: see Retained earnings.

Prepaid expenses: represents expense items which, while paid for in the current fiscal period, will not be totally consumed until the next period but do not have a useful life of more than one year. Examples include office supplies and subscriptions.

Referral fee: money paid by Travel CUTS to the Canadian Federation of Students - Services/AOSC for student travel business derived by Travel CUTS due to its relationship with AOSC. The amount is determined according to an agreement set up with Revenue Canada in 1979, with the fee set at 1% of the value of sales of travel products to students.

Retained earnings: the cumulative balance of annual surpluses and deficits over the total period of operation of an organization. If all the assets were converted to cash and all liabilities paid, the retained earnings is the amount left over or the shortfall which would occur. In a non-profit organization, Retained earnings are called Members' surplus (deficit).

Share purchase: the issuing of new shares by the subsidiary (Travel CUTS) to the parent corporation (Canadian Federation of Students - Services/AOSC) to increase the working capital position of Travel CUTS as required by the International Air Transport Authority, other licensing groups and general cash flow needs.

Statements of assets, liabilities and members' equity: the summary of what an organization owns and owes at a specific point in time. (Also called the balance sheet.)

Statements of changes in financial position: presentation of the source and uses of cash by an organization during the fiscal year.

Statements of revenues and expenses: report which shows the revenues and expenses incurred by an organization within a specified period of time, usually one fiscal year. (Also called the income statement.)

Surplus: the excess of revenues over expenditures for the current fiscal year.

Working capital: the difference between current assets and current liabilities. Minimum working capital requirements are often set under licencing and bonding arrangements for Travel CUTS.
