

We, the undersigned member locals of the Canadian Federation of Students, would enact our rights under the Bylaws (Bylaw V, Clause 5, Subclause b) to initiate removal proceedings for the National Chairperson, Jessica McCormick.

We would cite the following violations of the Bylaws as having occurred within the last two weeks:

A petition document from individual members of Laurentian University from within their graduate student population, sent by registered mail, was returned to sender due to the Federation's mail not being checked for four months. This is a violation of the Bylaws.

(Bylaw I Clause 3, Subclause a, i; Clause 6, Subclause a; Clause 6, Subclause b, i.)

We would cite the following duties of the National Executive in Bylaw IV, Clause 4:



The National Executive:

a. shall observe and uphold the objectives of the Federation; ...

g. will administer the affairs of the Federation in all things and make or cause to be made for the Federation in its name, any kind of contract into which the Federation may lawfully enter, subject to the direction of the national plenary;

h. will be bound and guided by the policy established by the Federation in all decisions made and positions taken;

We would note that the National Chairperson is "the chief spokesperson and representative of the Federation" (Bylaw IV, Clause 5, Subclause b). As the Chairperson is the chief representative of the Federation and lead member of the Executive Committee, it behooves the National Chairperson to bear responsibility for the failing of the National Executive to uphold the Federation's Bylaws as noted above.
